DIRECTORS REPORT:

Quarterly:

We have provided a copy of 2013-2015 last quarter reports to compare.

DROP IN'S = Steady increase over the years which is good news in my mind; I look at drop in's as future pass holders.

PASSES = A steady climb an increase of nearly 7k since 2013. This is great news and I'm sure it has a lot to do with the donation Providence Health Services gave us 3 years ago – the facility can handle many more people.

PROGRAMS = A decrease of 2,377 for this quarter. You will see a bump every year in November under programming. Normally we are running basketball programming and transition out of one age group and into another in November. Generally we will have secondary programming overlapping basketball – like dodgeball or game nights for the age groups who are not playing ball. This will not happen at all without a Rec. Ops Leader. You can expect one program at a time and likely the basics according to the community's desire – clearly basketball will be high on the priority list.

SKATERS CABIN = A steady climb... it will be interesting to see if a new vault toilet will increase usage!

ODIAK CAMPER PARK = I am not exactly sure why this is included in this report because it clearly isn't Bidarki Rec. Center revenue. However, the last quarter is always interesting. Since Odiak Camper Park closes October 1st, you are seeing the revenue that is actually past due and trickling in from the tenants. A low year doesn't necessarily mean that our management of the park was outstanding; It may mean it was a pour fishing season and they will continue to pay us into the new year! As of 2014 we no longer were willing to reserve spaces for those who have not paid in full by Dec. 31st.

MAINTENANCE UPDATE:

Over the break the roof started leaking at Bidarki again. Although, I was on vacation, I was in the building every day. I checked on the roof; the floor and my staff. This is the same time of year the roof leaked last time. The weather conditions in general, this time of year, cause water to be trapped under a layer of ice. The ice also builds up around the drain not allowing the water to escape. Staff inspected all of the roof, and the patches that were made two years ago, are still in good shape. The area on the high side of our sloping roof has a few areas that could be patched. These areas were clearly never patched the last time. Perhaps because they were on the high side and the patching process is extremely long and requires a very dry area...(just my assumptions here). There are clearly holes left unpatched and as


soon as we get the ideal conditions to fix them we will. So far, the maintenance staff has maintained a clear drainage path and they check it frequently.

Other happenings:

- A ceiling fan was installed at Skaters Cabin so the cabin heats more efficiently during winter rentals. They also installed a door closer so the door would automatically close after people exit.
- A utility sink was installed at the pool. It will be used to rinse testing agents on a daily basis rather than the eyewash station which is currently being used.
- Iceworm Banners we placed on main street.
- Christmas décor was removed from City Hall.
- The harvested logs from Nirvana that we will be making into benches (for the park) were skinned and moved inside the shop in preparation of building.
- New cutting boards were placed on the fish cleaning station.
- Trees were blown down at Nirvana Park and staff was dispatched to recover them. They were hung up on trees nearby and could have cause a problem if another windstorm hit prior to removing them completely.
- Staff secured the far shooting station in reparation of the Iceworm basketball tournament. We
 were able to reduce the amount of recoil after a shot. Patrons should be happy with the result.
- New crash mats will be ordered next week for the gymnasium in Bidarki.
- Heather has purchased attractive collection boxes for various fundraising related to our facilities and programming. The first box will be placed at Bidarki for the drinking fountain/ bottle filler.
 They are nice collection boxes that lock.

PROGRAMS:

We have nearly finished the 5&6th grade basketball program. I am the lead coordinator on basketball at this time and I have hired a temporary employee as an assistant, Jake Borst. We have coordinated with the high school. Our 5&6th grade championship game is actually schedule at the high school during the tip-off tournament. The kids and parents are very excited about the opportunity to demonstrate how much they have improved. The pictures below are the four teams with their coaches and the ALL STAR team.





Dear Commission,

I have included two pool schedules for the purpose of this discussion. One is the current schedule that would cost the City \$35,000.00 in temporary employee funds by the end of 2016 and does not include:

- Extra open swims during school breaks or the summer.
- LG training
- Swim lessons.

We are currently funded 25k for temporary employee funds at the pool. We have been funded 25k for a number of years and we have consistently gone over budget by at least 20-30k annually. We have always managed however, to come in under budget on our bottom line, until 2015 (45k over). I have asked for more money a number of times. Council has never increased the budget to cover the temporary employee funds to maintain 'status quo' (related to service) in either division (Bidarki or the Pool).

Clearly it is not fiscally responsible for me to continue to offer the same schedule. We have reached the threshold. Goods, shipping and services are constantly increasing in price and unexpected expenditures are always present. For three years running we have turned in a flat budget. I was able to come in under budget without changing the schedule, this is no longer an option.

The second scheduled included here is a schedule that reflects what services look like on budget (\$25,000.00) this schedule does not include:

- Extra open swims during school breaks or the summer.
- LG training
- Swim lessons.

The cost of providing all of the services not included on either schedule (in temporary funds) is estimated below:

Extra open swims on holiday's & in the summer:	\$3,600.00
LG training (in 2016):	\$ 500.00
Swim lessons:	\$ 2,800.00
- 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1 - 1	\$ 6,900.00

We must also consider the fact that the more users we have costs also increase in chemicals to maintain water quality, electricity & fuel to heat showers & fresh water (due to a substantial increase in water displacement). We've danced this dance before; there is an enormous amount of variable to consider when estimating a cost in these areas.
