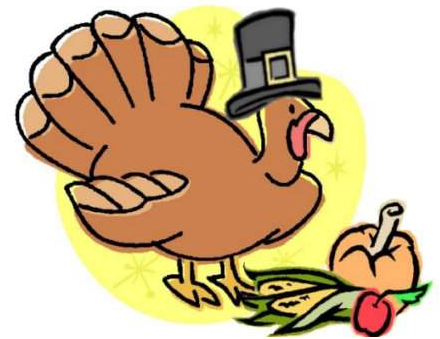

Re: Plat note modification for Lot 2 Block 7 North Fill Development Park

## **PART I. BACKGROUND:**

**10/12/2000** P&Z approved and recommended that City Council approve an amendment to the plat note on Plat 86-6 North Fill Development Park which removed Lot 3, Block 7 and Lots 1, 2 and 3 Block 8 from the plat note.

**10/18/2000** City Council approved Resolution 10-00-66 amending the plat note as recommended by P&Z

**11/12/2013 P&Z** reviewed and discussed a new request to modify the plat note again, this time by removing Lot 2, Block 7 from the plat note on Plat 86-6 North Fill Development Park

A request has been made to modify a plat note that was recorded when the North Fill Development Park was platted in 1986. The current plat note reads:

“Access is not permitted along Railroad Avenue to Lots 1 & 2, Block 7 and Lots 3A, 4 & 5, Block 8.

The amended plat note would remove Lot 2, Block 7 and would read:

“Access is not permitted along Railroad Avenue to Lot 1, Block 7 and Lots 3A, 4 & 5 Block 8.”

At the **November 12, 2013** P&Z meeting the motion below was made and passed

**M/McGann S/Greenwood**

“I move to recommend to City Council to remove Lot 2, Block 7 North Fill Development Park from the plat note that is recorded on Plat 86-6 North Fill Development Park.”

Vote on motion: 7 yeas (Bailer, Reggiani, Greenwood, McGann, Pegau, Baenen, Srb). Motion passes.

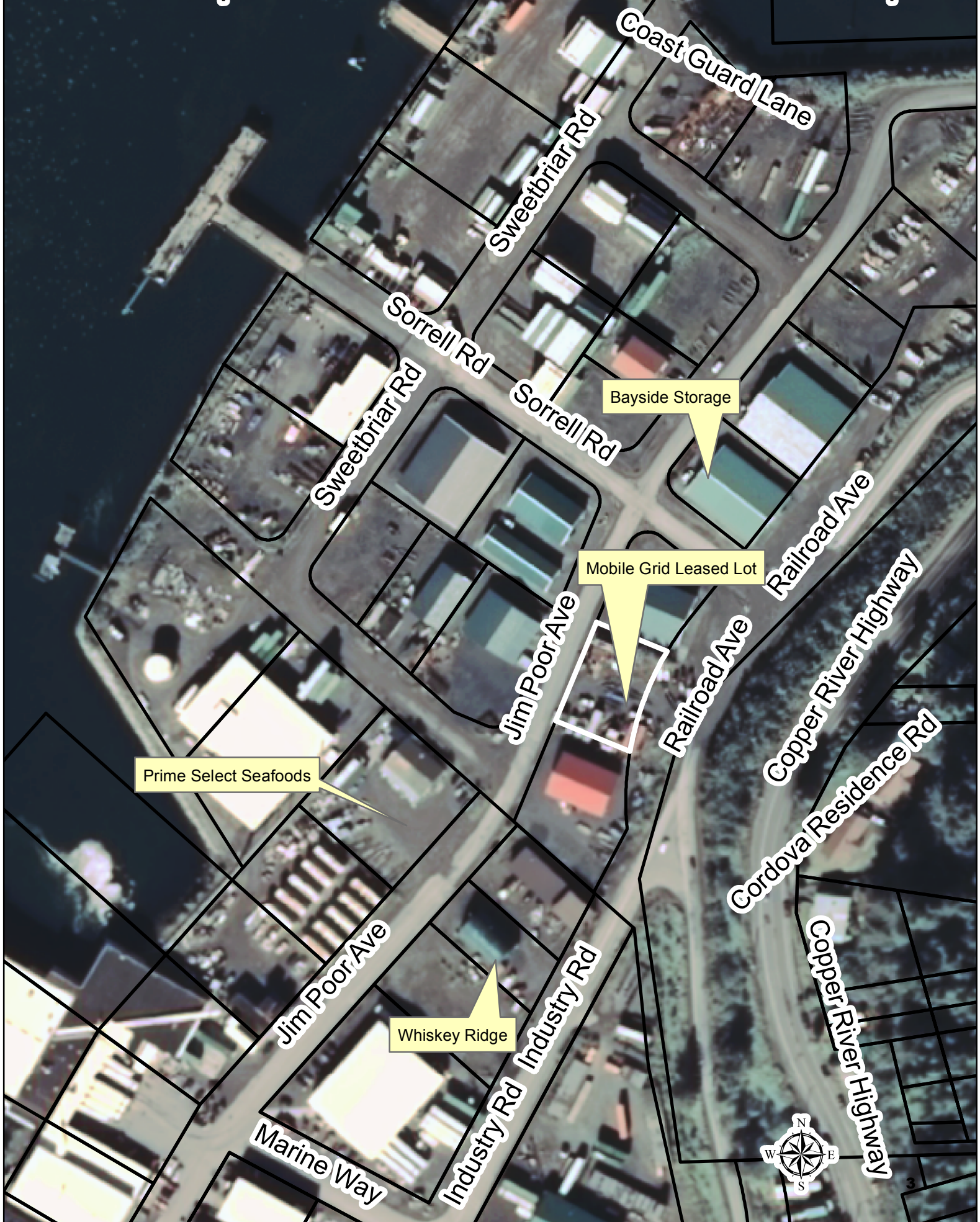

Council had a discussion of whether to bring up two or three out of town candidates. It was decided that all three of these men listed above would be asked to come to Cordova for in-town interviews. The scheduling was tentatively set for the following: candidates to come to town Sunday June 2 then a meet and greet that evening followed by interviews on Monday and then a special meeting Tuesday to make an offer.

*Don Moore* said make the interview a conversation with them. Speak to their different stories. Draw out information from them.

Meeting days and times were adjusted and Council opted to have candidates arrive on Sunday. Meet and Greet Monday, then interviews, all three, on Tuesday morning and then straight into executive session for Council to make a decision on making an offer. The start time was determined to be 11 am and allow an hour for each interview.

Council began discussing timing for a needed special meeting for the HSB as well. Wednesday May 29, HSB would meet at noon and then a Council Special Meeting at 12:15 in the City Hall Meeting Room. The meet and greet was more formalized for 5-7 pm on Monday June 3 at the Reluctant Fisherman.

**Carpenter** said that the City has put out an RFP for a marketing plan for the Cordova Center and a few things caught her eye. First, it says the grand opening is June 2014 and she finds that troubling and it is a super tight timeframe, she said it allows only five weeks to do this work; she feels as though if June 2014 isn't going to happen, then why be in such a rush to do the marketing plan? She asked for the rest of Council's opinions.

**Bradford** said June of 2014 is aggressive.

**Allison** said everything is worth a second look.

**Cheshier** said we are in a big giant rush for nothing.

**Reggiani** said he doesn't see the need to rush the marketing plan for the Cordova Center. He said it sounds like we need to rethink the proposal a little bit. He thought it wasn't appropriate for us to do anything with this at a special meeting under council comments; instead it would have to come before them on a future agenda. He wondered the timing of the RFP, when it was due.

**Sherman** said that the deadline was coming right up, on May 30.

**Moore** said a Council discussion is warranted if you so choose. He said this came up suddenly one night at a Council meeting and an appropriation was made and staff went forward with it.

**Mayor Kacsh** asked **Sherman** why this short time frame. **Sherman** said that it is about seeking funding. The marketing plan is within the business plan which is a necessary component when seeking funding. She said we have received responses and if none are good enough we can reject them. This is the direction Council gave to staff; to complete the business plan, she would like to move forward with that.

**Reggiani** asked about the process. He assumed it would come before Council before a contract is let.

**Sherman** and **Moore** both said, it is under the \$25K threshold so it did not need to come back before Council. **Reggiani** said he would prefer that it did.

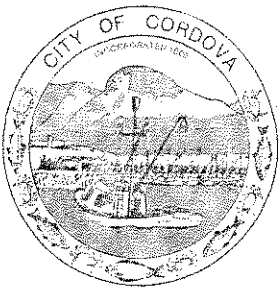

Memo to City Council

Re: Mt Eccles Elementary School Covered Playground Restoration Project

**CMC 5.12.040 "Council approval of contracts" says:**

*No contract for supplies, services or construction which obligates the city to pay more than fifteen thousand dollars may be executed unless the council has approved a memorandum setting forth the following essential terms of the contract:*

- A. The identity of the contractor;*
- B. The contract price;*
- C. The nature and quantity of the performance that the city shall receive under the contract; and*
- D. The time for performance under the contract.*

I recommend the city enter into a contract with Dar-Con Corporation of Anchorage, Alaska, to perform the restoration of the Mt Eccles Covered Playground at the Mt Eccles Elementary School as set forth in the attached Dar-Con proposal dated 10/29/13 (Exhibit A), PND Design Drawings dated 10/1/13 (Exhibit B), and Site Lines Clearance Drawings and Game Time Equipment Lists (Exhibit F).

The total contract price is not to exceed Three Hundred Forty Two Thousand, Three Hundred Dollars (\$342,300.00).

A summary of the nature and quantity of the performance the city shall receive is set forth in the attached Dar-Con proposal dated 10/29/13 (Exhibit A), PND Design Drawings dated 10/1/13 (Exhibit B), and Site Lines Clearance Drawings and Game Time Equipment Lists (Exhibit F). The contractor will have 71 days to complete the work from the date of the Notice to Proceed. Substantial completion is anticipated to be on or before 1/30/14. Brown Insurance/APEI is fully funding the project and is responsible for covering any and all changes related to this project. Brown Insurance/APEI has also agreed to fund a Project Manager of the cities choosing to oversee the project on the cities behalf.

**Recommended action:** Voice Vote.

I move to direct the City Manager to enter into a contract with Dar-Con Corporation of Anchorage, Alaska, to perform the restoration of the Mt Eccles Covered Playground at the Mt Eccles Elementary School for a sum of Three Hundred Forty Two Thousand, Three Hundred Dollars (\$342,300.00).

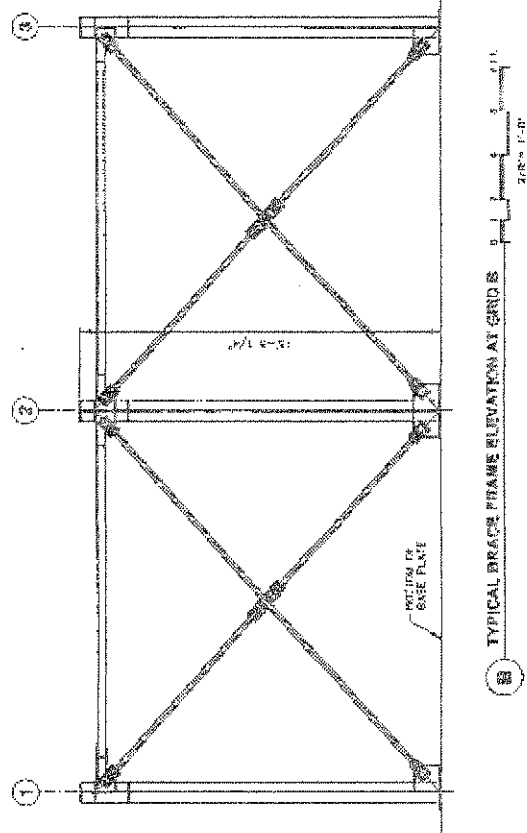
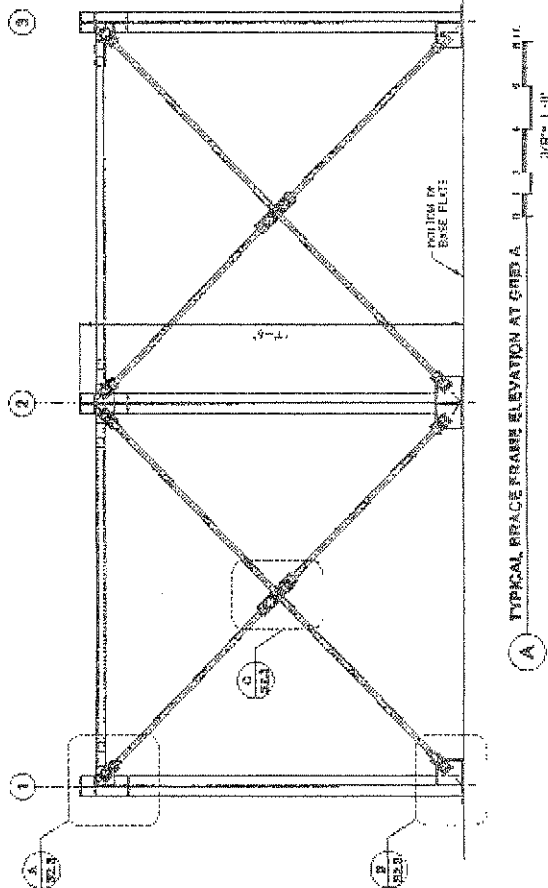


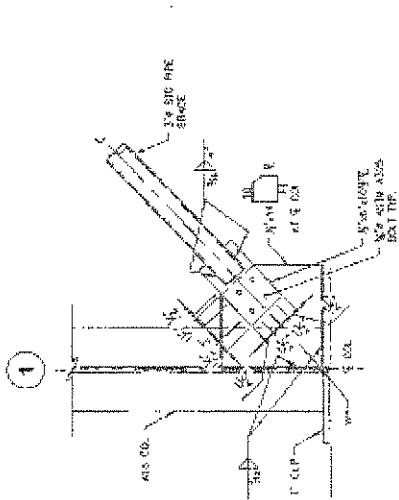




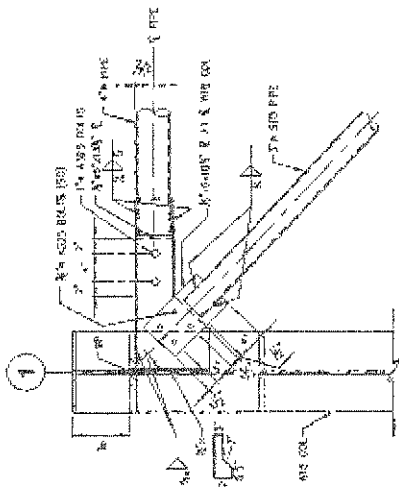


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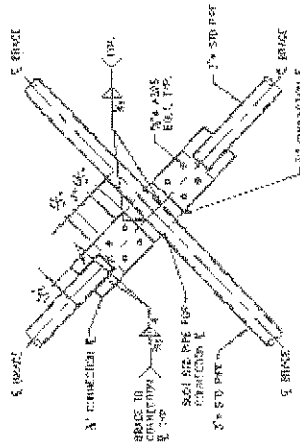
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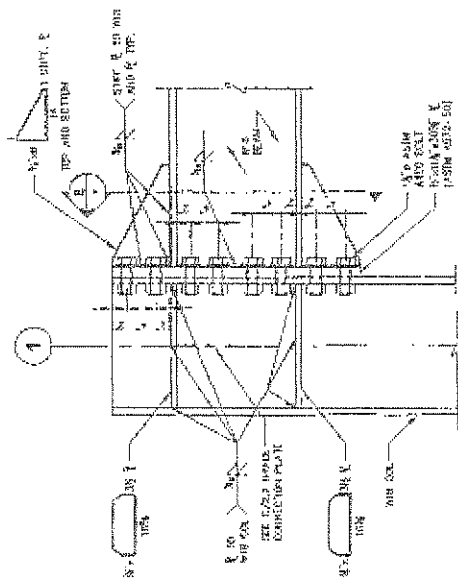
**A** BRACE TO TOP OF COLUMN  
GRID A



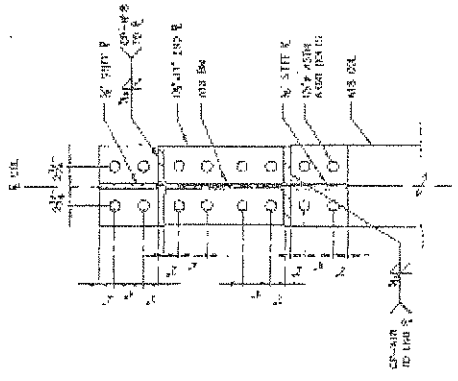
**B** BRACE-BASE OF COLUMN DETAIL

CENTER OF BRACE FRAME

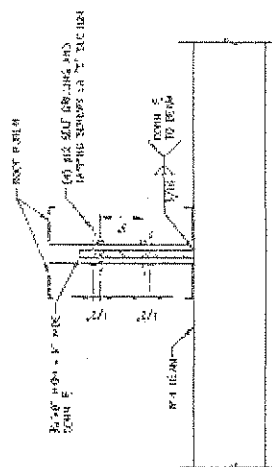
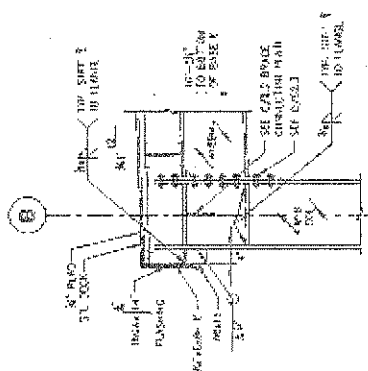
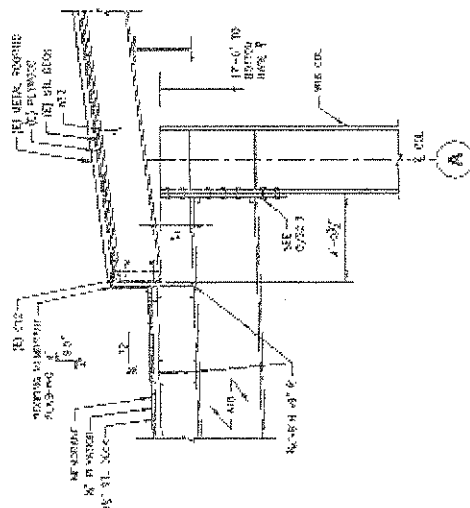
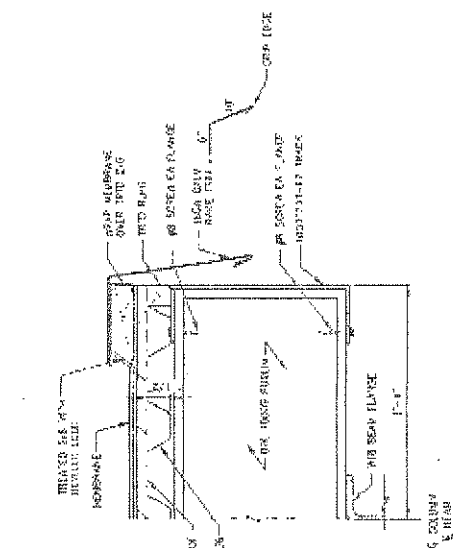


**D** BEAM-COLUMN CONNECTION

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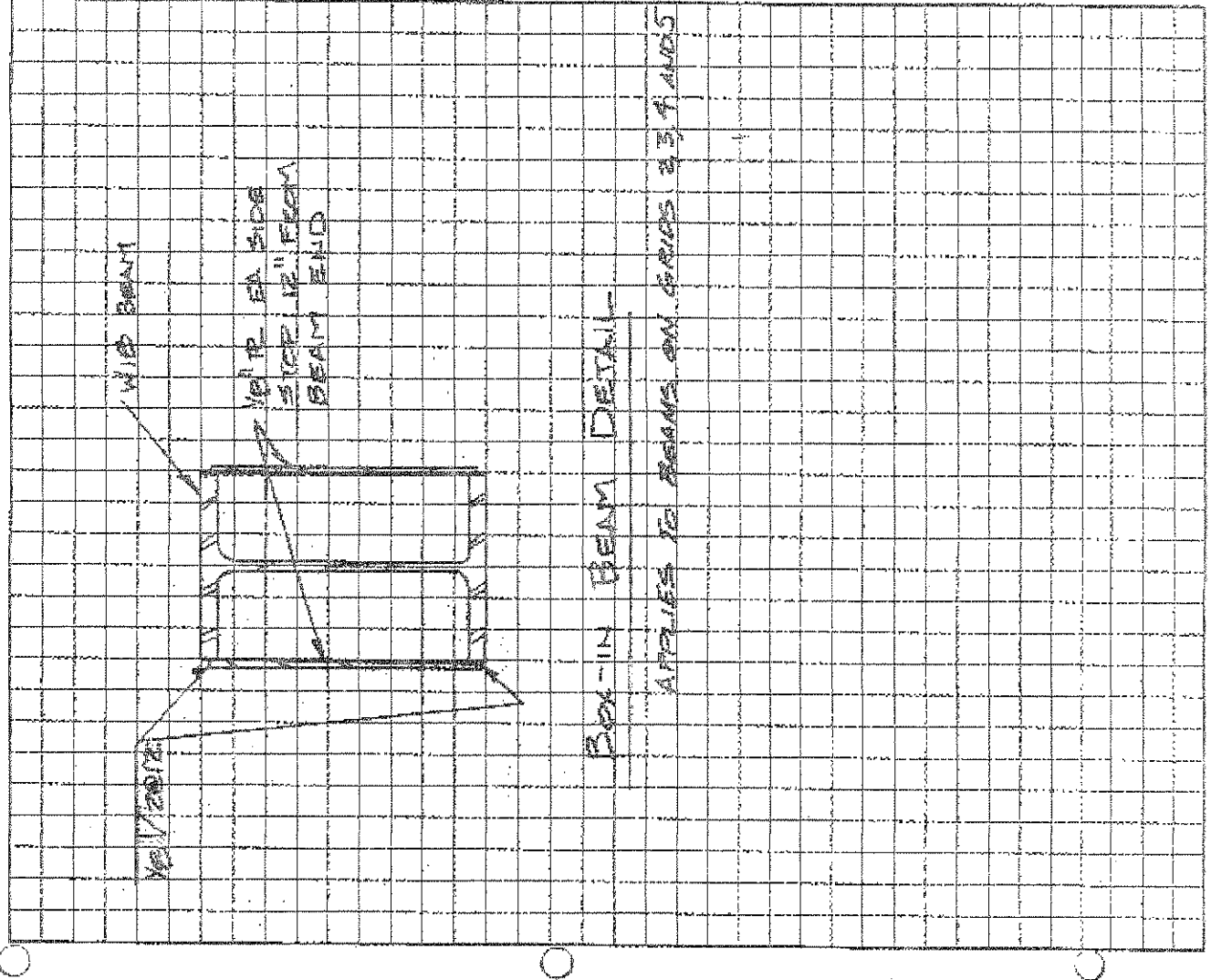

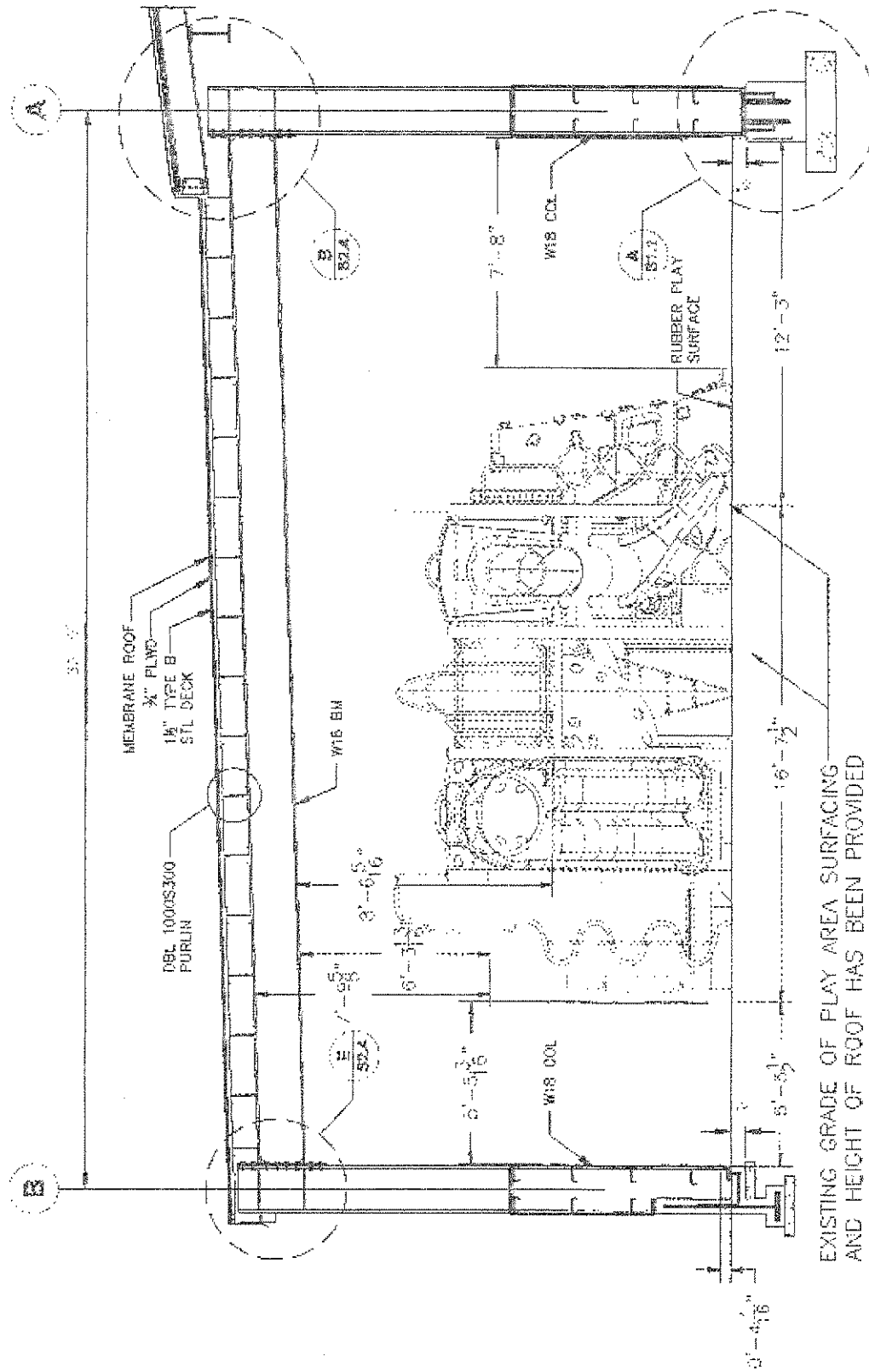

Thank you for your letter of concern regarding the mechanical problems currently being experienced with the Whittier ramp and the delay of the M/V Tustumena at Seward Ship's Drydock, and requesting support for greater investment in Alaska Marine Highway System (AMHS) infrastructure.

In response, I would like to begin by saying that while the two above mentioned projects have resulted in service delays due to contractor errors, the projects themselves are examples of the Department's ongoing efforts to maintain the physical infrastructure and the condition of AMHS vessels and terminals.

It is very unfortunate that a qualified and licensed commercial electrical contractor, while performing much needed and straightforward electrical repairs to the ramp, did such extensive damage. This was due to avoidable contractor error; the same exact work was performed successfully by another electrical contractor on the Wrangell terminal ramp. Similarly, the second round of delay during the overhaul of the M/V Tustumena can be directly attributed to inadequate welding practices and procedures at the Seward Shipyard. All three of the above mentioned repair projects were funded with federal dollars and were required to be awarded to the low bidding contractor. AMHS is pursuing contract provisions to hold the contractors responsible for damages and delays. The Department will also investigate ways to reduce the likelihood of similar occurrences in the future.


The past winter of 2012/2013 we saw service cancellations which for the most part were due to severe weather and the difficulty fast ferries have operating in those conditions. Going forward, AMHS management will work towards reducing winter fast ferry use and instead rely as much as possible on the M/V Aurora in Prince William Sound during the winter.

I would like to stress that the Department is committed to maintaining the infrastructure of the system and the condition of the ships, and substantial capital funds have been dedicated for that

purpose. Currently the M/V Columbia and the Fairweather are receiving new engines with the Chenega to follow next winter. We are in the process of updating the electrical systems on the ships and building a new reservation system. We are also well on our way to building two new dayboat Alaska Class ferries and have started the process to design a Tustumena replacement vessel. In addition, we are also moving forward with new terminal infrastructure at Haines, Skagway, Kodiak and Prince Rupert after recently completing a new terminal at Annette Bay in Metlakatla and a terminal reconstruction in Angoon.

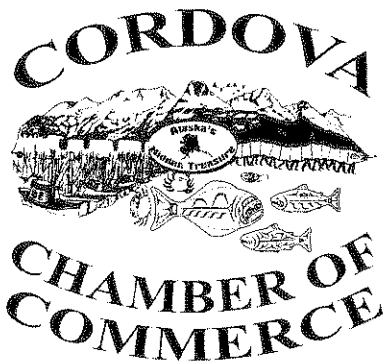
In closing, again, please be assured that the Department is firmly committed to providing dependable service to Cordova, Prince William Sound, and all areas that rely on AMHS.

**Subject:** *Investing in community bear safety measures in Cordova*

With budget deliberations on the agenda for this evening, it is timely to discuss prevention measures the city council can fund to improve safety in our community for bears and people.

This fall, at least 5 black bears were killed as they ventured into our community in search of food. Because we live in an area that is rich in fish and berries, it is inevitable that there will be some overlap in areas used by bears and by people. However, when bears are compensated with human food, they "set-up shop" and inevitably become too comfortable existing in close proximity to our homes and businesses. The end is often that they are killed. Five dead black bears will not impact the population as a whole. However, there are a number of reasons why Cordova needs to do a better job taking care of garbage.

- Public safety is at risk when bears are shot in city limits. Citizens may kill a bear under Defense of Life and Property (DLP) provisions. This means firearms being discharged by untrained individuals in close proximity to homes and businesses. This concern was validated in 2001 at the Copper River Seafoods cannery when an individual attempting to shoot a bear in a building, shot another person through a wall.
- Public safety is at risk when bears become habituated to trash. A good dumpster is a resource worth defending. All bears can be dangerous when surprised or when they are protecting their food. This year, a bear got inside a dumpster at the Reluctant Fisherman and the Anchor Bar, both on major pedestrian thoroughfares between the boat harbor, bars, canneries, and commercial buildings.
- Officers are forced to spend time dealing with bear calls instead of responding to other safety concerns. Last year, there were 10 bear calls between July and October. This

year, there were more than 35 in the same time period. This drains valuable public safety resources.

- Bears distribute trash making it harder to keep Cordova clean.

The easiest way to address these issues is to make trash inaccessible to bears.

- Dumpsters should be outfitted with bear resistant lids. In Valdez, they decreased the number of bears killed in town from 20 last year, to one this year, simply by using bear resistant lids. Other communities such as Kodiak and Juneau have also used them with great success.
- The city already has about 15 lids ready to deploy but we have closer to 50 dumpsters that need updated lids.
- Dumpster lids can be retrofitted for between \$500 and \$1000 each. It is more cost effective to purchase lids in bulk.
- Communities across the US and Canada use bear resistant lids and see it as an investment in the safety of their community and the health of wild bear populations.

The Alaska Department of Fish and Game is working with the Cordova Police Department, the Alaska State Troopers, and the City Refuse Department to explore ways to improve bear incident prevention. Thank you for considering replacing dumpster lids as a way to continue to improve our fantastic community.

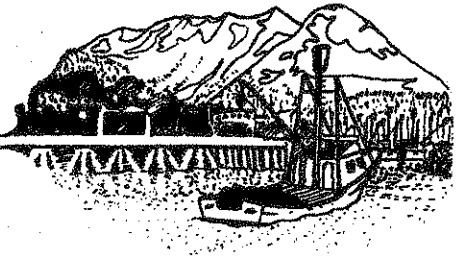

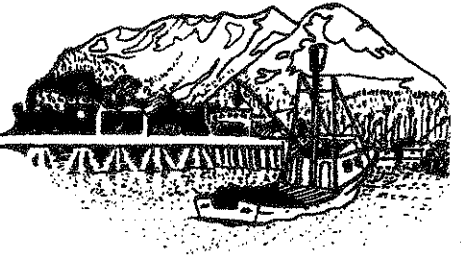



Hello:

I am writing this letter to voice my concern over a certain school district policy that I believe is detrimental to the community. As you are all aware my wife and I are in the process of starting a new non-profit corporation in town dedicated to youth sports and life skills – Cordova Amateur Youth Athletics Corporation. We have implemented a basketball program in partnership with NBC Basketball Camps and Sports Leadership Ministry. The program is a six week long fundamental skills clinic in which some 20 trained coaches are instructing 80 kids in grades 2-8 in basketball fundamentals. We are currently in our second week of the program and it is going exceptionally well. The program is based out of the Mt. Eccles gymnasium and we have some days reserved at the Jr/Sr High school gymnasium.

Going into the program I was made aware of the fact that our kids may get bumped by school teams because school sports have priority for gym use. I figured that we may get bumped by a JV or varsity basketball team so I made it a point to speak with the school coaches about this program and was assured that the basketball teams would only bump us if they got bumped out of the high school gym for a concert or event. All the school coaches are extremely supportive of this program. We hold practices from 3:45 until 7:00 pm Monday through Friday and have fun games/scrimmages on Saturdays. Our divisions are grades: 2/3/4 – 5/6 & 7/8 and each division practices one hour a day.

I was informed this week by the superintendent that our kids would be displaced for the entire month of December, the last three weeks of our season, by a school cheerleading team. I contacted the school team coach and begged her to hold her practices in the evenings for the first three weeks of December until the end of our program. She said no. She has the privilege to say no under the current school district policy. I did not even argue with her. She is reserving the gym for three months beginning in December – right in the middle of our practice time (from 5:00 pm until 7:00 pm) no ifs ands or buts – no call to me to discuss a compromise. The policy allowing her to do this must be changed. One program should not be allowed to totally destroy another simply because it is defined as a “school team program”.

We are currently attempting to move 80 kids and 20 coaches around to accommodate this other sports team. It is my understanding that the other team may have a total of 5 to 10 kids in it. I was told by a parent of a cheerleader that last year the cheer squad had 7 kids. I am losing my head coach and

may lose several other coaches because of this reorganization. I'm pretty sure a lot of kids will quit the program too. You as members of the school board need to take a look at this policy and consider modifying it. A policy that allows five to ten kids to displace 80 kids and 20 coaches is a policy that must be changed. 80 kids equates to probably 60 families in this town that will be affected.

We are an all-volunteer group. Nobody makes a dime. In fact, every one of our coaches paid \$100 to be trained over a three day period and my wife and I have pumped thousands of our own dollars into the program to help get it off the ground. Of the 80 kids in the group probably 70 attend school in this district and 10 or so are homeschooled. All we are trying to do is to play basketball with kids and provide positive role models in their lives. It seems that every time I turn around somebody is trying to destroy this program. I don't get it. I cannot handle the drama that surrounds this school district. That gym was built by the City of Cordova and by our tax dollars. It was built for all of us to use.

I respectfully request that every member of the school board respond to me in written format, email is preferred, and give me your opinion of the policy and whether or not you would be willing to modify the policy before we are displaced. Please remember that the superintendent works for you and that you work for the parents of the kids in the schools – the same kids in our program. The superintendent is enforcing YOUR policy but is doing so with a blatant disregard for our program. Common sense and human decency must prevail. There has never been a program of this size or caliber in this town. If you would prefer to see kids wandering the streets of Cordova with nothing to do rather than spending an hour a day in the gym participating in an organized sports program then don't act. If you enjoy watching the Jr. High ball teams lose by 50 points because our kids don't even know how to make a jump stop or pivot or shoot a ball then don't do anything. But if you agree with me, and you think youth sports programs are a vital part of a small Alaskan town's heart and soul then please help me save this program.

Be advised that your written responses to me will more than likely be provided to all the parents of displaced student-athletes in our program, to our coaches, to the city council and other city leaders and to any other interested parties.

I told the superintendent that I would try to get back to her about changing our practice time slots for the month of December by this Friday November 15, 2013. I have requested late night gym time for our 7/8 Division but I'm not sure it will work out. Our 5/6 grade kids are totally displaced at this time and are simply too young to have a late night practice and our 2/3/4 kids will likely lose a few practices a week.

Time is of the essence. I look forward to hearing back from you,
