STATE OF ALASKA CRIME LAB COMPLETES ANALYSIS OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE

Fentanyl discovered in conjunction with the recent overdose death in Cordova

Cordova Police Department Chief Taylor announced the findings of the State of Alaska Scientific Crime Detection Laboratory regarding the controlled substance discovered in conjunction with the recent overdose death in Cordova, Alaska. The controlled substance was confirmed to be Fentanyl, though resembling 30 M Oxycodone Hydrochloride.

"These deadly drugs are circulating in Cordova and there's really no way to distinguish these from Oxycodone," said Chief Taylor. Fentanyl test kits, provided by Project HOPE (Harm reduction, Opioid Prevention, and Education), are currently available at the Cordova Community Medical Center, Sound Alternatives, and Ilanka Community Health Center.
